

# WRITING A SPIRITUAL LOVE LETTER

## Sharing Your Values and Blessings in Your Estate Plan

**Here are a few reflection questions to guide your writing.**

### Beliefs and Values

- What do you believe about God?
- What are your views about marriage?
- What is your philosophy when it comes to raising and educating family?
- What are your convictions about church, discipleship, and outreach?
- What are your guiding principles for handling money?
- Are there other truths and values that have guided your life?

### Life Lessons

- What lessons did you learn from your grandparents, parents, and other mentors?
- What were some of the defining moments of your life and what did you learn from them?
- For what life experiences are you most grateful?
- What have been some of your greatest disappointments or regrets?
- What were some of your proudest achievements?
- What are the keys to developing a Christ-like character?

### Writing Your Letter

Writing a spiritual love letter may feel daunting at first. However, if you view it as a love letter to your family, the process can be spiritually deep and satisfying. Furthermore, since this is not a legal document, the content, length, and form are completely up to you. There’s no wrong way to go about it!



## Sharing Your Letter

Once you've completed your spiritual love letter, make sure to save it along with your will, in a safe location where your personal representative knows where to find it. In doing so, you will leave your family a tangible gift of love, hope, and encouragement they can carry with them in the years to come.

- What message of hope and encouragement do you wish to leave to your loved ones?
- What did you most appreciate about your family and friends and how did you grow closer to God because of them?
- What is your greatest hope and prayer for your family? What spiritual blessing do you want to give them?
